

Ji's Site 2008

Ji's Site was developed over a period of years at the Menlo Park, California, Family History Center (a branch of the Family History Library, Salt Lake City, Utah) as a private project with no official connection to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. The program contains thousands of free genealogy links in a graphic display, all carefully researched and categorized. You will be able to learn about your ancestry online at no cost through vital records (births, marriages, and deaths), census records, immigration lists, church records, and much more. The [premium edition](#) of Ji's Site offers proprietary information for a nominal payment.

Ji's Site is optimized to display in a full browser window at a screen resolution of 1024 by 768 pixels. Most browsers are set to show several toolbars at the top of the screen. This will cause Ji's Site to lose part of its display space and result in a scroll bar on the right side of the screen, but will not affect the operation of the program.

Mozilla Firefox may be installed as a dedicated Ji's Site browser without optional toolbars at the top. The latest version of Firefox is found at:
